But statistics can skew things to seem like nothing good is happening, when in fact many ministries

and churches are serving the poor and reaching out evangelistically. Wherever God's Spirit is alive and well in a congregation he'll be pushing for the church to make Jesus known among new peoples.


Tom left his home in Tucson, Arizona after giving all of his earthly possessions away. He flew to Milwau-

Some people, however, try to challenge him. They try to trip him up by challenging him about









the world. The famous French historian, Alexis De Tocqueville, credited the pulpits




This past month, my wife and ▲ I rededicated our marriage vows at a wonderful celebration put on by the Rhode Island chapter of the National Organization for Marriage. Our children were with us to share in this great day, as we witnessed hundreds of couples once again commit themselves to one another. This tremendous event took place at the Aldrich Mansion in Warwick, a beautifully scenic property overlooking

Less than a week later, a friend asked me if I had seen the huge mob of demonstrators at the ceremony. While we had seen a handful of protesters holding up signs outside the grounds of the property as we drove through the gates, I had no idea what he was talking about. Thus, I was shocked when he e-mailed me a "report" by an alleged Christian "investigative reporter" which recounted how an unruly pack of homosexuals climbed over fences and surrounded the couples, wrapping them all up with white ribbon. This alleged Christian "investigative reporter" was not present at the ceremony, but had merely watched a short local news clip and jumped to his own conclusions.

At first I thought about how his "report" was extremely exaggerated, but, upon reflection, we must call this "report" what it is: a LIE. Yes, if this alleged Christian had been at the ceremony, he would have known that the white ribbon was used to rope off the section for the couples. He also would have witnessed one lesbian couple who exchanged vows in protest.

Alleged Christians do more harm to the body of Christ than all the ungodly protesters in the world. They discredit the Church by legalism, ignorance, and - as in this case - lying. Don't you get upset when ungodly groups

tell lies about Christianity and Christians that get widespread mass media coverage? So then how can you expect the unsaved to ever come to know the Lord when alleged Christians tell lies about God's

diately claim that they are indeed going to heaven, that their salvation is assured because one day a long time ago they repeated a few phrases at an altar in some church somewhere, beware: you will know them by their fruit. Unfortunately for these alleged Christians, they will be in for a rude, irreversible awakening at their judgment day.

So, should we focus on reaching the lost, or saving alleged Christians? It is possible to do both, but some would argue that you should spend more time preaching to the unsaved, since alleged Christians

heritage and history. They have little or no understanding of the principles of Natural Law--something America's founders knew almost by second nature (no pun intended). They seem to know next to nothing of the Biblical principles of liberty and government. All they seem to be able to do is regurgitate some mindless interpretation of Romans 13--an interpretation that could have been written by King George III or even Adolf Hitler.

Ignoring the great examples and exhortations of both Testaments, today's Christians seem to have lazily latched onto a modern-day "divine right of kings" philosophy, through which they have become the pathetic slaves of arrogant and pompous political wolves dressed (barely) in the sheepskins of legitimacy.

Where are America's watchmen on the wall? Where are the great stories of courage and commitment demonstrated by America's founders that once emanated from church pulpits? How is it that today's Christians know more about sports celebrities than they do America's heroes? How is it that these lying, conniving, con artists called politicians can sucker church members as easily as they do the un-churched? How is it that Christians do not seem to recognize the devilish doctrines of socialism, fascism, elitism, or globalism for what they are? How can they be so easily manipulated? How is it that these corrupt politicians--who vote to kill unborn babies, merge America into internationalist and global entities, strip Americans of their God-given natural right of self defense, promote homosexual marriage, or allow America to lose its identity, culture, and heritage through unbridled illegal immigra-

Where once preachers stood in the similitude of Elijah and John the Baptist, they now grovel in the image of Joel Osteen and Rick Warren. Sunday Schools were once bastions of Bible teaching; today they are glorified coffee shops and playgrounds. The modern Christian home cannot even disciple its own children: how can it then be expected to "make disciples of all nations"?

I repeat: the modern American church has, for the most part, become irrelevant.

It is little wonder that more and more people are losing interest in the organized church. Instead of finding Christian love and kindness, they find the same kind of gossip, slander, petty bickering, favoritism, and selfishness that they might find at any office water cooler. Instead of hearing a prophet of God declare the Word of God, they hear a milquetoast minister meekly musing the latest self-help book.

The complete irrelevance of today's organized church in America to the preservation of Christian liberty and constitutional government is especially disconcerting to those of us who still have freedom's fire burning in our souls. Where do we go for respite and instruction?

I tell you the truth: there are hundreds of thousands of patriotic,

freedom-minded Christians all over America who have had it "up to here" with these spineless social clubs called churches! They are tired of petrified pastors groveling before corrupt politicians and businessmen. They hunger for truth, and they are not finding it in most organized churches.

As an example, go to my list of people who have written me to let me know that they are desperately seeking a Black Regiment-type church that they can attend. The list grows by the day. See the

These people are not looking to be entertained or pampered. They do not care about social standing or making "business contacts." They don't care which church has the "most exciting" youth program, or how many softball teams it has. They want a church where the pastor isn't afraid to speak truth to power and take a stand for liberty. And, unfortunately, such churches are getting harder and harder to find.

In fact, I submit that the true church is not "emerging"; it is "submerging." As in totalitarian regimes all over the world, where there are basically two types of churches: the organized State-approved church, where people who worship the State go to put on a religious show; and the underground church, where real Christians go to worship God with honest, likeminded believers.

The "underground" church in America is not totally underground--yet. But the schism is taking place rapidly. Unlike the houses of State Worship, which enjoy large congregations and ornate buildings,

underground churches are, for the most part, small and unassuming. Home churches are also mushrooming and must be considered part of the underground church movement. And, of course, Black Regiment churches are springing up all across the country. You can

find a list of them at our website.

I am convinced that it is through these independent, unaffiliated, unorganized, or underground churches that relevancy will return. It is in these churches where Christians can be taught the Biblical principles of Natural Law, where children who are disciplined and know how to behave are not considered oddities, where pastors aren't afraid to proclaim truth, where people are still committed to constitutional government--and understand the difference between a democracy and a republic--and where self-serving neocons are not regarded as heroes.

So, if you are a Christian and you want to be relevant to the preservation of liberty in this country, you need to get out of these establishment, State-worshipping churches and find yourself an "underground," unaffiliated, or Black Regiment church. And you need to do it quickly!

those of his former life. For most of his life the primary three things that Tom knew were drugs, alcohol and women. His life was one big party and over the years he married and divorced three times and left four sons in his wake.

How does a man evolve from an irresponsible party animal to one on a pilgrimage for Jesus Christ? What caused the change? His is a story of a man addicted to many things, from serious drug usage to acquiring possessions, rising and falling again and again until he became addicted to the love of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Here is his story.

Tom was born in Iowa in 1965 to a fifteen-year-old girl who gave him up for adoption. He was adopted by a wonderful couple who later adopted another boy, David, who now lives in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The family was Catholic and Tom attended parochial schools. He was a good athlete, participating in basketball, football and baseball. He said that being a sort of class clown and athlete did not sit well with the ever vigilant

Tom never had thoughts of going to college. His grades were only marginal although he believes he would have been an all-state-all conference athlete. Regardless of what aspirations he might have had, things changed when his girlfriend became pregnant while in their senior year of high school. This "Threw a wrench into everything," Tom said.

They married in December, 1983 and soon afterwards, Thomas, his first son, was born. Becoming an adult and a father so abruptly was very difficult for Tom. He said that he began drinking and using drugs to replace the fun and excitement that he used to have playing

When baby Thomas was less than a year old, Jeremy was born and about one year later Tom began to use cocaine. His life became a blur of smoking weed, snorting cocaine, drinking and chasing after women. By age 22 he had a severe addiction to cocaine. Then, along came Cole, son number three.

The inevitable divorce took place, and as a result of a relationship with another woman, another son was born. By 1992, Tom was obsessed with cocaine or getting high in any manner possible.

Tom took a job as a bouncer and his six-foot-four-inch menacing persona made him quite successful. He "beat up people for a living. I was an enforcer if anyone got out of line. I actually enjoyed

Tom moved to Tucson, Arizona with a woman who would later become his 2nd wife. He did not tell her that his primary interest in moving to Arizona was that the drugs are cheaper there. He was employed by a contractor remodeling homes, earned good money, and stayed on for about fifteen years. Tom said that he would "disappear" for a while occasionally to binge on cocaine. This eventually led to his termination.

For a while Tom had a stint smuggling marijuana from Mexico into the United States which was quite lucrative. All of his money was used for "constant partying," though. He was, "like a big kid who always wanted to play" he said. As a result his bills piled up, he got evicted a few times and was homeless for a while, living in his

pickup truck.

Around the end of 2002, Tom entered a detox facility, something he had tried a few times before and it never worked out. While there he was arrested for an old charge and spent 23 days in jail. He got drunk as soon as he got out but, court ordered, he returned to detox.

It was there that he met Pastor Larry Munguia, an ex-hippie, former-cocaine addict and previous drummer in a band. Larry was a group leader and Tom had to attend his groups because he had to have his attendance sheet signed to satisfy the courts. Larry is also a Christian who encouraged Tom to turn to God.

Tom kept debating, arguing every point to the extent that Larry offered a challenge. He suggested

that Tom pray one prayer for seven days, that if God were real that he would give him a sign so that he would know He was real. Tom decided to do it, not believing that it would work

A few days afterwards, Tom was sitting on a park bench dialing the number of a drug dealer on his cell phone. Then, looking down between his feet, he saw a cross, woven out of reeds. Awestruck, viewing that as his sign, he surrendered his life to Jesus Christ that night. "That was the battle." By this he meant the fight to keep his mind fixed on Jesus Christ while smothered by all that the world hurls at us.

He stayed clean of drugs for sixteen months before he turned his attention and reliance away from Christ. He began his own remodeling company. Did well at it and got

married again, in 2006, only to divorce in 2007 and then another relapse.

Along the way he helped Larry start up The S.O.B.E.R. project located in Tucson, Arizona. The acronym is for Service Obedience Bonding Education **R**elationships. The S.O.B.E.R. Project is a faith-based 12-step program and recovery church which began in 2004. So far this year 7,858 have attended a Bible based 12-step meeting. 143 made a salvation commitment. You can learn more about this project by going to www.thesoberproject.com

Tom could not understand that no matter what level of involvement he had with the church he could not recapture the feeling of excitement he

> had when he first accepted Jesus Christ. He kept falling down and getting up. Several years ago he had proposed to Pastor Larry that he embark on a walk for the Lord but the pastor cautioned that he was not ready/stable enough and to wait a while. Tom began to increase his time reading the Bible and studying but what he really wanted to do

> Tom began to realize that during the seven years that he tried to push drugs out of his mind and life, he was substituting them for something else: things which society deems important. He found that in between serious relapses, he became addicted to nice clothes, cars, a motorcycle, tools, etc which he finally saw as taking things away from the Lord. "Things of the world are

not bad," Tom said. "it depends on what we do with them." He decided to give his life over to the Lord once and for all. That was a pivotal time, a time when he further determined to walk for the Lord. Ironically, a friend took him to see a film about Arthur

when," Tom said, "I stepped into Blesset, a man who walked with a cross throughout 315 countries, 7 continents, and 38,102 miles. The Guinness Book of World Records 1996-2008 lists this as 'The World's Longest Walk.' A story about Mr. Blesset's walk appeared in the July 09 issue of this paper. As Tom began his own walking journey, he soon saw that God was going to take care of him. Everyday he has just enough food, drink, and minutes on his cell phone and a place to rest. The three things that Tom knows now, he said, are "Love God with all your mind, soul, and strength, love your neighbor as yourself and tell people about Jesus. I know where I was at in my life before Christ, how I came to know Him and where I am now."

"It is awesome that so many people stop to talk or pray with me." Tom assures us, "I am not doing this to get to heaven. I am doing this because I am going to heaven and I want people to go there with me. I don't beat people over the head with the Good News of Jesus Christ; I let them come to me because they are curious about the cross and I tell them my story and what Jesus did for me."

Recently Tom's brother-in-law Paul mentioned Tom's walk to a fellow churchgoer, Kyle Tekiela, an Emmy award winning video-producer. As a result Kyle felt led to develop a website, www.tomscrosswalk.com where

anyone can track Tom's progress and communicate with him during his walk. After all is said and done Kyle will be creating a documentary of Tom's journey. If you have had contact with Tom or have something to contribute send info to Paul Marotte P.O.

So despite the decline of active Christian faith in New England over the past 3-4 decades, there is a resurgence of churches and church planters that God is calling to reach new people in this region.

One of these churches is New Hope Christian Church of Swansea, MA. Pastor Dave Therrien has been serving at New Hope since 1991. Their vision is to "love God, Love each other, and reach the world." There is no doubt that they are committed to 'reaching the world' when one looks into their portfolio of service and mission. Pastor Dave took me by the wall in the church where they post pictures of all the missionaries and ministries they are supporting. Among those on the wall includes a group of pastors and medical clinics from a major work in Togo Africa as well as many outreaches to the poor and homeless.

I got the opportunity to interview Pastor Dave about the New Hope New Bedford church plant, which starts Sept 20th.

How did you feel God leading you to start a new church?

"For the last several years I've had

a burden for a city, either Providence, Fall River or New Bedford. Where there is a great concentration of people, there is a wider harvest field. I started hearing about churches in movie theaters and approached the Flagship Cinemas. The manager was very enthusiastic to have a church service in his theater."

Will this be the first church plant of New Hope?

"This will be our second church plant. Our first church plant is in North Kingstown, RI under Pastor Peter Atkin, who was formerly my assistant. How are you going about planting the church in New **Bedford?**

"Promotion is a big part of the

church planting strategy. We will be hanging 1,500 door hangers on the neighbor's doors on a coming Saturday, we advertise on our radio and cable tv shows and we hope the The Good News paper will give us much public awareness. Not that we want to draw Christians from other churches, but we're hoping Christians will tell their non-Christian friends about 'church at the movies' and their curiosity will get them there."

What are you excited about? What obstacles will there be?

"I am excited about bringing the Word of God to a new group of people, and using the technology available to make it happen. We will have a live worship team and a volunteer staff. The message will be streamed on the "big screen." People can expect a contemporary service, greeters, live band, announcements, etc. Everything will be live except for message portion. Hopefully, the people will adjust to this new format."

What do you have in place for the New Bedford people to grow and stay connected?

"We offer a "home group" in New Bedford that I teach every other Monday night. For more info on the home group, call the church

> (508-324-4500). There is a chance that more groups can develop from this new congregation."

Do you see church planting as a major vehicle of fulfilling the great commission?

"I love church planting because it brings the church "to the people" rather than make everyone come to one location. The church plant reduces driving distance and allows the church to have a farther-reaching impact."

Any other key thoughts, points or stories you'd like to share?

"This idea of "church at the movies" is popular in the midwest and on the west coast. Some churches use movie theaters to hold their services but we are the first ones I know of (in this area) to run a video of the main message. We hope to plant a string of churches in movie theaters as it is affordable to do, centrally located for each community, and far-reaching."

We are excited for New Hope to be reaching out to New Bedford and our prayers will be that many unbelieving people of New Bedford come together to encounter God in a fresh new way.

While New Hope is expanding into New Bedford, a cluster of pioneers are church planting in Providence. Providence is home to its own cultural paradoxes, from rich to poor, from PhD's to non-English speaking, blue collar patriots fans to bike riding vegans, and the paradoxes go on. How does the church respond to such a place?

Renaissance Church has been in Providence for about 6 years. Planted by North Providence Assembly of God and led by Scott Axtmann, Renaissance has been one of the leaders in penetrating the culture of Providence. Consisting of large percentages of RISD and Brown students they have cultivated faith among the intellectual

> and the artists. These two demographics have been very difficult for many churches to connect with. Renaissance has moved around a lot, from the West End back to the East Side, in the Benefit St. Armory for a number of years, to an elementary school on Wickenden. In the spring of this year, God crushed

Pastor Scott Axtmann's heart for South Providence. "I was driving through and praying for God's lead and God's will for where we were to move, and as I was driving through South Providence and Elmwood, my heart just broke for the poverty, I began weeping." Six months later they are negotiating a lease to move into a Hollywood video plaza off of Reservoir Ave. They have a vision to see a racially and socio-economically diverse church birthed in the South Providence neighborhoods that would reflect the diversity of the area and would also serve as a source of hope and service to those broken down by poverty.

Providence Mission Church was launched in the fall of 2008 in the West Side Arts Gallery on Westminster St. in Providence's West End. Their vision is to call the city to reconsider the gospel. Believing that many people feel as if they are "over it" or "have been there done that" with Christian faith, Pastor Travis Mullen believes that the church has turned many people off before they ever had the chance to understand a full presentation of the gospel with lives that back it up. So they are hoping to demonstrate the gospel with their lives and as a church while communicating it through relationships and teaching. They also want to see the Church more unified through pastoral prayer meetings and allcity ministries.

Among the other new churches that are seeking to reach new people in Providence are Downcity Church, Grace Harbor, Providence Christian Center, and more. Please join New Hope and the church plants in Providence in praying "your kingdom come and your will be done." May God's kingdom be expanded through churches that are fulfilling the Great Commission to "go and

Marriage Supporters Turn in Marriage Petitions

(EP News)--The Stand for Marriage Coalition in Maine is asking for a question on the November ballot that would restore the definition of marriage as one man and one woman. To that end, they have turned in 100,000 petition signatures. They only needed 55,000 signatures to qualify. In May, the Legislature voted to allow gay marriage, making Maine the fifth state to okay the practice. Gov. John Baldacci signed the bill into law. Question 1 would repeal the law. Executive Director of the Christian Civic League of Maine Mike Heath says the response is encouraging. "As we've known for years," he said, "when this matter is made plain to the public there is huge resistance to it and opposition to it."

Massachusetts Law Enforcement Braces for Gambling Trouble

(EP News)--Massachusetts will likely legalize slot machines this fall in an effort to solve its budget woes. As a preventative measure, Attorney General Martha Coakley and a handful of lawmakers are pushing for a crime bill that would help law enforcement fight the criminal activity that always accompanies gambling expansion. Family advocates, like Evelyn Reilly, director of Public Policy for the Massachusetts Family Institute, see the crime bill as missing the point. "What should be the focus of concern here," she said, "is the heart of this entire enterprise, which is the legalization of slot machines." Research shows video slot machines are particularly addictive.

Americans Are Clear: We Do Not Trust "Obamacare"

(EP News)--As news rolls in of Americans participating in town hall meetings in record numbers, a recent Rasmussen poll shows that support for President Obama's health care plan is waning quickly. Just 42 percent of Americans currently support the President's plan, while 53 percent oppose it. "As details about abortion funding, rationing of care, higher costs and less access to health care surface, Americans are expressing their distrust of a government-run system. Average Americans who have never been politically involved before are coming out in droves. They fear that their government officials, who have spent trillions on pet projects like obscene art and luxury planes, now plan to hijack control of our health care. "The message is clear: We don't trust Obama or Congress -- especially with our health care," stated Concerned Women for America's President Wendy Wright.

Petitions New Hire at DOJ to Handle LGBT Issues

(EP News)--The Department of Justice has hired gay-identified attorney Matt Nosanchuk as point person on lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) issues for the Civil Rights Division. Nosanchuk was a leader in the LGBT policy group during the Obama campaign. Joe Giganti, a conservative talk-show host from Washington, D.C., said he thinks it's the administration's way of calming the demands of gay activists. He says the new post also legitimizes the gayactivist movement. "By putting a gentleman like Matt Nosanchuk in there," he said, "they are insulting real civil-rights laws and the people that have struggled in the history of our country due to race, color and creed."

Minnesotans Challenge Hotel Porn

(EP News)--Commissioners in Olmsted County, Minn., are planning to ask area hotels to stop offering pay-per-view pornography. The commission is also planning an ordinance directing county employees to stay at "clean hotels" when traveling on business. Vickie Burress, assistant coordinator for Citizens for Community Values (CCV) in Ohio, said accessibility to in-room pornography is bad for families. "We applaud the commissioners in this Minnesota county," she said, "because there are so many people affected by pornography across the nation. We don't want our tax dollars going to pay for people to use hotels that have hardcore, explicit pornography." CCV has surveyed hotels across America and identified those that do not offer pornographic movies.

Evangelist regains First Amendment rights

In 2004, Jesse Morrell traveled to an area of New Haven where young adults frequented bars -- and where he hoped to share the gospel peacefully. Alliance Defense Fund (ADF) attorney Jonathan Scruggs picks up the story.

"On four separate occasions, two police officers essentially came up to him and ordered him to move, ordered him to stop speaking because he was annoying people," he recalls. "Evidently his message was not being well received by the college students."

Scruggs says the police did not receive Morrell's message well either. "The police officers who were working at the bar came and forced him to leave and,

Lutheran Denomination Liberalizes Sex Teachings

(EP News)--The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) Churchwide Assembly, meeting August 17-23 in Minneapolis, adopted a new policy that departs from traditional Christian teachings. The new policy leaves room for the church to approve and bless non-marital sex, both homosexual and heterosexual.

The 4.6 million member, mostly liberal-led ELCA, has lost nearly 1 million members across 4 decades.

Previously, the ELCA declared that marriage "is the appropriate place for sexual intercourse." The new policy deletes that standard, instead calling only for "social trust" in associations that are "loving," "life-giving," "fulfilling," "nurturing," and "commit-

ted." It suggests that heterosexual relationships "are best served through binding commitment, legal protections, and the public accountability of marriage;" but it concedes that "some cohabitation arrangements can be constructed in ways that are neither casual nor intrinsically unstable."

Regarding homosexuality, the new ELCA policy claims that "consensus does not exist." It presents four "conscience-bound beliefs," ranging from disapproval of all samesex relations to honoring them as marriages, as equally valid. It makes no effort to discern which view is more faithful to Scripture or Christian tradition.

Mark Tooley is president of the Institute for Religion and Democracy. His group monitors the actions of mainline churches. He said, "How sad that the ELCA no longer affirms the timeless Christian understanding of marriage. Instead it is touting secular psycho-babble about 'fulfilling' and 'nurturing' relationships. How will the church's young people interpret this tacit approval of at least some non-marital sex?"

"In embracing moral relativism, the ELCA assembly has disregarded the Bible, the views of its own members, and the pleas of Lutherans in Africa and Asia. It has left the mainstream of U.S. and global Christianity, instead following other shrinking denominations like the Episcopal Church and the United Church of Christ towards internal division, accelerating membership loss, and cultural irrelevance."

Rep. Frank lashes out at protester for Nazi remark

DARTMOUTH, Mass. - Rep. Barney Frank lashed out at protester who held a poster depicting President Barack Obama with a Hitler-style mustache during a heated town hall meeting on federal health care reform.

"On what planet do you spend most of your time?" Frank asked the woman, who had stepped up to the podium at a southeastern Massachusetts senior center to ask why Frank supports what she called a Nazi policy.

"Ma'am, trying to have a conversation with you would be like trying to argue with a dining room table. I have no interest in doing it," Frank replied.

He continued by saying her ability to deface an image of the president and express her views "is a tribute to the First Amendment that this kind of vile, contemptible nonsense is so freely propagated."

Frank, who chairs the House Financial Services Committee, sought to assure more than 500 people attending the rowdy meeting that the average taxpayer wouldn't be hurt by plans currently under consideration in Congress.

Some of those attending the meeting organized by the Democratic Town Committee of Dartmouth shouted and booed as Frank and others addressed the crowd. At one point, Frank asked the crowd: "Which one of you wants to yell next?" Several people wanted to know how the government would pay for the reforms without worsening a growing federal budget deficit.

White House says 'drill, baby, drill' - in Brazil

(OneNewsNow) An energy analyst says he cannot understand why the Obama administration is borrowing money to lend money to Brazil so it can conduct oil drilling off its eastern coast, yet will not support oil drilling in American waters.

The Wall Street Journal reports that the Obama administration has agreed to lend \$2 billion to Brazil's state-owned oil company, Petrobras, to finance oil exploration off the country's coast near Rio de Janeiro. The U.S.

At least two dozen protesters gathered in small groups outside, handing out pamphlets and holding signs criticizing the overhaul, Obama and Frank. Some of the posters read: "It's the economy stupid, stop the spending" and "Healthcare reform yes, government takeover, no. Tort Reform Now".

Audrey Steele, 82, from New Bedford, said she does not want the government to get involved with health care because "they just make a mess of everything," referring to the \$700 billion bailout of financial institutions that was used to pay for lavish conferences and hefty executive compensation.

Others at Tuesday's meeting were more supportive of reform. Dr. Sheila Leavitt, a physician from Newton, said she hoped for changes that would support primary care physicians who aren't paid as much as specialists. She said some of the rowdy critics at Tuesday's meeting appeared to be using the same "talking points" as those who showed up at similar meetings around the country.

Export-Import Bank has issued a "preliminary commitment" of \$2 billion to Petrobras, but may loan more. Earlier this month, a Brazilian official said the U.S. could provide up to \$10 billion for the drilling project.

David Kreutzer is senior policy analyst in energy economics and climate change at The Heritage Foundation. He questions why the United States is not drilling in its own deep-water oil fields.

"Why aren't we getting oil from the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge?" he wonders. "There are tens of billions of barrels of petroleum that we could get in our own water, and even onshore, that have been blocked by people in Washington; and here we're lending money to people in Brazil to get oil -- it does seem silly, and I can't explain the thinking."

Kreutzer says U.S. opposition to drilling in its own oil fields is stupid in its own right, but that giving money to state-run oil companies to drill in foreign oil fields is more silly -- especially given the fact that the Obama administration's "cap-and-trade" policy seeks to limit America's use of petroleum and other fossil-based energies.

Meanwhile, Bloomberg.com is reporting that George Soros, a major contributor to the Democratic Party, is also a major investor in the Brazilian oil company. According to that report, he recently repositioned himself in that investment by trading his common stocks for preferred stocks, which offer a larger dividend.

New poll shows most Israelis want Temple rebuilt

JERUSALEM, ISRAEL (ANS)

-- A recent survey has found that 97 percent of Israeli adults surveyed know the Jewish date of the Holy Temple's destruction falls on Tisha B'Av, the annual day of mourning and fasting which was marked on

In another remarkable finding, two-thirds of Israelis would like to see the Temple rebuilt, according to the Ynet-Gesher survey released today, according to the International Christian Embassy Jerusalem (ICEJ).

Some 64 percent of Israeli adults

surveyed, including about 47 percent of secular Israelis, said they would like to see the Temple in Jerusalem rebuilt. Eighty percent of respondents said they think it is justified to mark an event that happened 2,000 years ago, while 13 percent said only events related to the modern state of Israel should be marked.

Second Temple era inscription unearthed in Jerusalem

Meanwhile, ICEJ also reports that a stone cup used by Jews in the Second Temple period for ritual hand washing before meals has been uncovered in a dig on Mount Zion in Jerusalem. On the cup is carved an unusual inscription in Aramaic, the language spoken by Jesus, that archeologists are having difficulty translating.

"This is a difficult script, not one that is worn or graded, which demands research," said Prof. Shimon Gibson, of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, who is co-directing the excavation close to the Zion Gate into the Old City.

He estimated that it could take months to decipher the inscription, which is a rare example of writing from the Second Temple era. The dig has also uncovered buildings that show the Jewish nature of construction in the area in the first century AD, as well as floor mosaics used in Christian churches from the later Byzantine period.

Netanyahu on European junket to defend Jerusalem

(ICEJ) Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu departed Monday on a four-day trip to Europe, where he is expected to tell EU and US leaders that Jerusalem will remain outside any settlement freeze and Iran is a much more urgent world problem to be dealing with.

Besides meetings this week with British Prime Minister Gordon Brown and German Chancellor Angela Merkel, Netanyahu is to rendezvous in London on Wednesday with US special Mideast envoy George Mitchell for critical talks on the Palestinian peace track.

One main topic in all his meetings will be US and EU demands that Israel freeze all Jewish construction in the West Bank and eastern Jerusalem. But Netanyahu will make it clear that Israel will not accept any limitations on its sovereignty in Jerusalem, said sources at the Prime Minister's Office. The PMO sources said Netanyahu also stressed that normal life in the settlements will need to be assured.

A source in Jerusalem said Saturday night that the gaps with Washington are closing but that several further rounds of talks will be necessary in order to reach a final understanding on the future of settlement construction, culminating in a meeting between Netanyahu and US President Barack Obama in September. Latest reports indicate the "face saving" deal may involve a nine to 12 month building freeze which would not apply to eastern Jerusalem or housing units already under construction.

Netanyahu said over the weekend that peace talks with the Palestinian Authority could start again by late September, but PA chairman Mahmoud Abbas continued to insist that suspended negotiations could only resume after a total settlement freeze, including in Jerusalem.

Meantime, while in the UK and Germany this week, Netanyahu plans to tell Brown and Merkel that if the EU does not impose tough economic and diplomatic sanctions on Iran now, it will make "non-diplomatic" actions later more likely. One official said that there was reason to be optimistic because since the disputed Iranian presidential elections in June and their bloody aftermath, there is now a "greater understanding in the international community as to the character of the Iranian regime," and therefore a "greater appetite to place pressure on that regime to" halt its renegade nuclear program.

"Sometimes the Europeans get very concerned when people talk about options other than diplomatic ones," the official said. "They have to understand that the more serious the steps today, the less there would be a need to resort to non-diplomatic steps later."

The Islamic Republic would be highly vulnerable to sanctions on such products as refined gasoline and diesel, since it imports almost its entire supply of these commodities, despite holding vast crude oil reserves. Other sanctions could include revoking the landing and docking rights of Iranian aircraft and ships around the world, and bans on doing business with Iranian banks and other institutions.

Israelis remind US of its land-grabbing past

(ICEJ) The international business consulting firm Frost & Sullivan estimates that over the next five years countries in the Middle East will buy as much as \$100 billion a year worth of military equipment, as fear of Iran and regional rivalries heat up.

Most of the spending will be made by Saudi Arabia, Iraq, the United Arab Emirates and Israel. Major items on Israel's shopping list include three squadrons of F- 35 fighter jets and two new missile ships.

Iraq, Egypt and many of the smaller states in the Gulf are buying new transport aircraft, helicopters and boats, as well as law enforcement equipment to control their increasingly restive populations.

The Saudi Arabian and UAE air forces have both received large numbers of new fighters and airborne radar aircraft, as their ballistic missile defense systems are getting major new upgrades and equipment.

Israel's own air and missile defense systems are also getting upgrades, as the Air Force last week completed work on developing a new battalion

Drug Company Money is Top Factor in Publication of Vaccine Studies

(NaturalNews) Flu vaccine studies that are funded by industry are significantly more likely to be published in prestigious journals and to later be cited in the scientific literature than studies without such funding, according to a survey of 274 studies conducted by researchers from the Cochrane Vaccine Field in Italy, and published in the British Medical Journal.

A good methodology, in contrast, had little impact on such factors. The study also found few studies providing good evidence that the flu vaccine is actually effective.

In principle, a higher quality study should be published in a more prestigious journal and should be cited more frequently than a low quality study. But the researchers found no relationship between study quality and either of those factors. Instead, having a study partially or fully funded by industry was the best way to boost the prominence of a study.

Overall, the authors also found that

There is no shortage of books about Western missionary heroes. But in the developing world, just as in the West, the most effective way to reach the lost is through the local church. As one Indian Christian leader told missionaries from abroad, "You have been offering the water of life to the people of India in a foreign cup. That is why we have been slow to receive it. If you offer it to us in an Indian cup, we are more likely to accept it." This is the new face of missions. The global church can learn much from the stories of indigenous missionary heroes.

In her new book, In the Presence of the Poor, author Kay Marshall Strom shares the amazing story of Professor B. E. Vijayam, Ph.D., a university professor and awardwinning scientist who has made a career of reaching India's poorest people with God's love. Dr. Vijayam was born the son and grandson of prominent Christian bishops in India, but he gained his reputation as a nationally recognized scientist. Driven by his pioneering spirit and limitless love for India's poor and forgotten souls, Dr. Vijayam is breaking new ground in missionary practice, and he has much to teach the Western church.

As a geologist, Dr. Vijayam dedicated much of his research to improving the living conditions for the oppressed Dalit people. He encouraged other scientists to venture past the hallowed halls of academia and bring technology to the poor. As the founder of organizations like MERIBA (Mission to Encourage Rural Impact in

Backward Areas), he achieved the unthinkable-uniting entire villages of Dalit people, educating them concerning their rights, and overturning centuries of culturally sanctioned tyranny. Through various other social action groups, he brought clean water, agricultural innova-

tion, and environmental protection to people all over India.

Dr. Vijayam is not just another social activist. Every technological innovation served a greater purpose—setting the stage to share the Gospel with India's 4,600 people groups. "To Dr. Vijayam, the gospel must be holistic," Strom says. "As the Bible says, it is no use telling a person who is naked and hungry to go in peace without actually taking care of that person's physical needs." Today Joshua Vision India, one of Dr. Vijayam's projects, trains church planters to use technology for the benefit of the people groups they

than just one man's story. It is a wakeup call to us in the Western church who have grown comfortable in our affluence and indifference to the plight of our Christian brothers and sisters in the developing world. Strom stresses the need for partnership between churches

Johannes Gutenberg invented the first moveable type printing press. His masterpiece, the Gutenberg Bible, was printed August 24, 1455. No longer copied by hand and chained to pulpits, Bibles were mass produced.

Unfortunately his business partner sued and took his rights.

Gutenberg, whose name means "beautiful mountain," wrote: "Let us break the seal which seals up holy things and give wings to Truth in order that she may win every soul that comes into the world."

In The Hunchback of Notre Dame, 1831, book 5, Victor Hugo wrote: "The 15th century everything changes. Human thought discovers a mode of perpetuating itself... Gutenberg's letters of lead...supersede Orpheus's letters of stone...The invention of printing is the greatest event in history. It is the mother of revolution."

Victor Hugo continued: "Whether it be Providence or Fate, Gutenberg is the precursor of Luther." In A Tramp Abroad, 1880, Mark Twain wrote: "We made a short halt at Frankfort-on-the-Main...I would have liked to visit the birthplace of Gutenberg, but...no memorandum of the house has been kept."

On August 12, 1993, at Denver's Regis University, Pope John Paul II gave a Gutenberg Bible to President Bill Clinton.

The Birth Of The Song 'Precious Lord'

Back in 1932, I was a fairly new husband. My wife, Nettie and I were living in a little apartment on Chicago's south side. One hot August afternoon I had to go to St. Louis where I was to be the featured soloist at a large revival meeting. I didn't want to go. Nettie was in the last month of pregnancy with our first child. But a lot of people were expecting me in St. Louis. I kissed Nettie good-bye, clattered downstairs to our Model A and, in a fresh Lake Michigan breeze, chugged out of Chicago on Route 66. However, outside the city, I discovered that in my anxiety at leaving, I had forgotten my music case. I wheeled around and headed back.

I found Nettie sleeping peacefully. I hesitated by her bed; something was strongly telling me to stay. But eager to get on my way, and not wanting to disturb Nettie, I shrugged off the feeling and quietly slipped out of the room with my music.

ing St. Louis heat, the crowd called on me to sing again and again. When I finally sat down, a messenger boy ran up with a Western Union telegram. I ripped open the envelope. Pasted on the yellow sheet were the words: YOUR WIFE JUST DIED.

People were happily singing and clapping around me, but I could hardly keep from crying out. I rushed to a phone and called home. All I could hear on the other end was 'Nettie is dead. Nettie is dead.'

When I got back, I learned that Nettie had given birth to a boy. I swung between grief and joy. Yet that same night, and our little boy together, in the same casket. Then I fell apart.

went to St. Louis. Something kept telling me to stay with Nettie. Was that something God? Oh, if I had paid more attention to Him that day, I would have stayed and been with Nettie when she died.

From that moment on I vowed to listen more closely to Him. But still I was lost in grief. Everyone was kind to me, especially one friend. The following Saturday evening he took me up to Maloney's Poro College, a neighborhood music school. It was quiet; the late evening sun crept through the curtained windows.

The next night, in the steam- I sat down at the piano, and my hands began to browse over the keys. Something happened to me then. I felt at peace. I felt as though I could reach out and touch God. I found myself playing a melody, once into my head they just seemed to fall into place: 'Precious Lord, take my hand, lead me on, let me stand, I am tired, I am weak, I am worn, through the storm, through the night, lead me on to the light, take my hand, precious Lord, lead me home.'

Tommy Dorsey

If you thought this was the same Tommy Dorsey of big band renown, than you are sadly mistaken. Thomas A Dorsey though born in the same era forged his music career as a blues bandleader. Thomas grew up in a strong Christian family in Villa Rica, in Carroll County, Georgia, his father was a traveling preacher and mother

a choir leader. Growing up in a poor family led Tommy to take a job in an Atlanta theatre where he often marveled at vaudeville performers. During this period he learned to play the piano and soon after began playing at house parties throughout the city.

Throughout much of his early adult life Tommy struggled as did many bluesmen, he was internally torn between the sacred and the secular—his devotion to the Lord and the "devil's music" he loved so much. After a conversion brought on by a nervous breakdown Tommy began to slowly pen gospel songs and was soon appointed director of the choir at the Pilgrim Baptist Church in Chicago's Bronzeville District, an association he would continue until 1972.

In August 1932 Thomas' wife Nettie died during childbirth, and his firstborn son, Thomas Andrew,

Jr., perished the very next day. Needless to say the events hit Dorsey hard, and he turned once again to his faith for consolation. He responded by writing one of the most famous songs of his career, "Take My Hand, Precious Lord," a tune later recorded by Aretha Franklin that has been sung in countless churches and at weddings and funerals in the decades since. These tragic events also marked the close of Georgia Tom Dorsey's work in the blues; from that point on he was committed solely to gospel music.

> Thomas Dorsey had over 400 gospel songs published and composed hundreds more. His "Peace in the Valley" is a favorite song of country performers and was a hit for Elvis Presley in 1957. The scope of his life's work is almost dizzying. Thomas Andrew Dorsey led a full life, rich beyond dreams in so many ways. He died on January 23, 1993. This peaceful man, who gave the gift of his music and himself, is credited with devising the term "gospel

music." What better legacy for a man who penned the words, "Take my hand, precious Lord, lead me home."
